METHODOLOGY

This probabilistic survey was conducted November 26 – 27, 2023, with 652 likely 2024 general election voters. It has a margin of error of $\pm 3.83\%$. Known registered voters were interviewed via online panel and SMS. This survey was weighted to a likely 2024 general election voter universe.
